Las Palmas de Gran Canaria says goodbye to the 32nd edition of The Atlantic Rally for Cruisers, the ARC regatta, returned on Sunday, November 19, to comply with regulations. The famous transatlantic nautical test, faithful to its appointment on the penultimate Sunday of November, for 32 years, filled the bay of the capital with multicolored, unfurled sails, more than 200 vessels that begin in this way the adventure of crossing the ocean towards the Santa Lucia Island, in the Caribbean.

Music and animation for those who have sailed and those who have come to dismiss the boats and their crews.
